	 Stop the Meters campaign is costing – petition currently stands at 2200 signatures with almost 250 paper petitions handed in Crowdfunder ended with £510 Initial survey indicates:- 72% said they would reduce their visits if metered:-11.5% would not change their habits:- 16.5% would not visit at all if they had to pay to park – this needs to be shown in a Press release – add 72% and 16.5% - very large percentage of people who would reduce/stop visiting Tavistock Further to Cllr. Jory's information from Stuart Hughes at the previous meeting (that a full consultation was on the cards along with impact assessment) – there has been no further engagement or movement on the issue JS to email Cllr. John Hart and Meg Booth, pressing for confirmation of the above Cllr. Jory spoke with Councilors today – nothing in diary regarding consultation and impact assessment - nothing happening at the moment No contact from Cllr. What can we do to persuade Landlords to perhaps split larger shops? – Cllr. Jory – perhaps provide financial enticement - waive fees for 12 months?
